I am Deacon Joseph Martuscello and I was born and raised in Corning, New York. I was Baptized at St. Vincent's Church of All Saints Parish. I have fond memories of All Saints Parish growing up, particularly liturgical celebrations at St. Vincent's, daily Mass at Immaculate Heart of Mary with my family, Saturday confessions at St. Patrick's, and Eucharist Adoration at St. Mary's in the Fr. Brennan Chapel. But perhaps the most memorable, at least to my mother, was during Christmas Midnight Mass at St. Vincent's.
